Part	To say	Response	Back-up
1	<p>Look at these pictures. They look the same, but some things are different.</p> <p>This boy's playing with a robot, but this boy's playing with a truck.</p> <p>What other different things can you see?</p>	<p>Describes four other differences:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • hat/no hat • 1/2 bags • open/closed door • white/red flowers 	<p>Point to other differences the candidate does not mention.</p> <p>Give first half of response: 'Here the woman's wearing a hat, but here ...'</p>

Show candidate Test 5 **Picture Story**. Allow time to look at the pictures.



Part	To say	Response	Back-up
2	<p>These pictures show a story. It's called 'A windy day'. Look at the pictures first.</p> <p>Tom's sitting in a tree. He's trying to read his comic but he can't hold it because it's very windy. A girl's playing with her kite.</p> <p>Now you tell the story. (pointing at the other pictures)</p>	<p>(Many variations possible)</p> <p><i>The girl's kite is in the tree. She's crying.</i></p> <p><i>Tom's climbing down the tree. He's holding the kite.</i></p> <p><i>Tom's giving the kite to the girl. The woman's giving Tom his comic. They're all happy.</i></p>	<p>1. Point at the pictures. 2. Ask questions about the pictures.</p> <p>Where's the kite? What's the girl doing? What's Tom doing? What's Tom giving to the girl? What's the woman giving to Tom?</p>

Part	To say	Response	Back-up
3	<p>Now look at these four pictures. One is different. The book is different. A lemon, a pineapple and an orange are fruit. You eat them. You don't eat a book. You read it.</p> <p>Now you tell me about these pictures. Which one is different? (Why?)</p>	<p>Candidate suggests a difference (any plausible difference is acceptable).</p>	<p>Where are these? (in bowl) And these tomatoes? (next to bowl)</p> <p>These can all ...? (fly) And this animal? (can't fly)</p> <p>What are these people doing? (phoning) And this girl? (singing)</p>

4	<p>Now let's talk about you and your home.</p> <p>Where do you live?</p> <p>Where do you do your homework?</p> <p>What do you like doing at home?</p> <p>Tell me more about your house/flat/ apartment.</p> <p>OK, thank you, *. Goodbye.</p>	<p><i>(name of town or city)</i></p> <p><i>living room</i></p> <p><i>playing computer games</i></p> <p><i>It's got 4 bedrooms.</i> <i>There's a balcony.</i></p> <p>Goodbye.</p>	<p>Do you live in <i>(name of town or city)</i>?</p> <p>Do you do your homework in the living room?</p> <p>Do you like playing computer games at home?</p> <p>How many bedrooms has it got? Is there a balcony?</p>
